
Degree Plan Walkthrough


Degree Plan A

This is an example of a Degree Plan. Here you will find a list of courses that have been completed and/or are needed. Each Degree Requirement is broken down into Degree Requirement Sections⁴. Within each section, there is the Course Subject¹, Course Number², Course Title³, Grade (if applicable), and two columns that signify whether or not the requirement has been met.



Course Listing B

This is a list of available courses for the listed term. If you notice, the nomenclature provided on this document is similar to that of your Degree Plan in order to facilitate your registration process. Each portion is broken down into Degree Requirement Sections⁴. Within each section, there is the Course Subject¹, Course Number², CRN, Course Title³, Term Name and Dates, Section, and Instructor.



These are the Terms available for the listed course.

Cross-Referencing

- In order to make sure that you register for the proper classes, you must first look at your Degree Plan A and find which requirements are still unmet. These are usually denoted by the highlight, and the credit hours needed in the 'Needs' column.
- After you find the courses you need, you will look under the Degree Requirement Section⁴ and match it with the Degree Requirement Section provided on the Course Listing B.

- In this example, the requirement for HIST 1302 has not been met. Cross-referencing back to the Course Listing B document, we look at the Course Subject¹, Course Number², Course Title³ and we see that there is one HIST 1302 course available under the American History Degree Requirement Section⁴. That means that this course can be used to fulfill the requirements of your Degree Plan A. You will use the CRN Number to register for the course through Goldmine.
- UTEP Connect online courses are not visible through Goldmine; therefore, it is important that you **register using the CRNs** provided to you on the Course Listing B from your UTEP Connect Student Success Advisor.

Important Registration Information

Enrollment levels during the summer term are identical to those of the fall and spring semesters.

If you are going to be taking multiple classes, we recommend you split them between the two Parts of Term available: Term A and Term B. For example, if you wish to take two courses in the Component Area Option section (6 credit hours), you could take COMM 1301 Term A, and UNIV 1301 Term B.
