








WHY IS WRITING ESSAYS IMPORTANT...

Keep in mind that for some classes you'll be asked to submit papers as a final exam instead of completing a test.



BEFORE WE START...

• Writing can be scary, especially if you don't know when to start.



BEFORE WE START...

- It's going to be okay
- The key to writing a great paper is GETTING STARTED.



UNDERSTAND WHAT IS REQUIRED

• This is BEFORE you start writing.

--> Review your assignment requirements and fully understand them.

Prompt #1

What are the similarities and differences? Make sure to talk about their historical and political importance and how they each contributed to the art movement of the

era.

Choose one of the two art pieces, then write a 1000 word essay saying why this piece is better/ more important than the other.

Prompt #2

• UNDERSTAND WHAT IS REQUIRED

- Knowing the range of topics and the specific formatting is the first step in starting your paper with organization and structure.
- You don't want to start working on a topic that's off-limits, vague, not answering the prompt, or in the wrong format only to find out later.
- Always, always, always clarify requirements before starting.

2. CHOOSE A TOPIC THAT INTERESTS YOU

- Whether your topic is already assigned to you or you've expected to come up with it, you should ALWAYS find the angle that speaks to you.
- You should go in a direction that is most engaging to you.
- You are more likely to write well about something that interests you.





2. CHOOSE A TOPIC THAT INTERESTS YOU

"Write what you care about, if you do that, you stand the best chance of doing your best writing."



3. OUTINE WITH DETAIL

• This is the most challenging step since it can lead your entire paper.

BUT

 This helps organize your points find your main argument and state them logically.
[ex: point 1 -> point 2]



3. OUTINE WITH DETAIL

 Having an outline will help you transition between paragraphs and help you talk about each point equally.

• Try making this outline as detailed as you can with what you want to include.
